

Course Description

Accelerated Math 7 is a two-semester core class focused on building foundational mathematics and providing students with an investigative approach to learning. This curriculum for seven grade helps students to learn essential and fundamental math concepts by utilizing interactive problems from everyday situations. Students will be introduced to a wide variety of math topics, including proportional relationships, equations and inequalities, solve problems involving two and three dimensional figures, comparing and scaling, as well as many others as outlined by the 8th grade Common Core Math Standards. The majority of class time will be spent increasing the depth of student understanding through investigation of selected topics, personal problem solving practice, communication, and teamwork skills.

This course will be modified as appropriate to meet the needs of identified IEP, TAG, and 504 students. These modifications will take into account both the level and rate of learning for individual students.

Classroom & Behavioral Expectations

My classroom expectation is to provide a safe and welcoming environment that encourages student learning and promotes mutual respect towards classmates. Student involvement in classroom rules and procedures is essential to adherence throughout the school year. I expect students to try their best, regularly attend class, come prepared to learn, treat others with respect, and ask for help when needed (before, during or after class). Student compliance of school rules and policies (as outlined in the student handbook) in addition to classroom guidelines and expectations is important to providing a safe learning environment.

Grading Philosophy

My expectation is that students come to class ready to learn and participate. Failure to complete class work may require additional time outside of school, but homework will be graded based on accuracy and students will have to opportunity to correct any missed problems for full credit. Any questions or concerns over the homework will be addressed the following class period. Tests and quizzes will comprise a large portion of their grade, but retakes and instructor assistance may be available. Students will be graded on a number of standards that can be found on the district web site and on our classroom walls. Students are expected to work to their full, individual potential. Grades will be based on a 100-point scale as follows:
